Introduction

Moving to a new country brings with it a series of opportunities and challenges. For parents, one of the most essential elements of settling into a new city is finding the right school for their children. Whilst Dubai has a wide range of schools to choose from, the process of searching and selecting the right school can appear daunting at first.

Outpost UAE Iraq has created this guide to serve as a starting point for employees and their spouses who are considering a move to Dubai or have recently relocated here. This guide may also be helpful to staff already based in the UAE and are considering changing their child's school. The guide outlines the general admission process (although some schools may have their own specific requirements) and other matters to bear in mind during the school search. It also aims to provide information regarding some of the schools in Dubai that may be of interest to the Shell community. While it is an extensive list, it is by no means comprehensive of all schools in Dubai so parents may wish to consult other sources of information:

Chapter 1 Curriculum Information

Curriculum Guide

Private schools in Dubai have a wide range of curricula. It is therefore important to make the best curriculum choice right from the start based on your future plan. This will subsequently enhance easy transition of your child into the school system or university of their choice. This guide provides information on the US, UK and the International Baccalaureate (IB) Curriculum as well as a curricula comparison table.

US Curriculum

- A wide range of subjects are offered all the way up to university level.
- Each subject is covered in a less in depth manner as there is more choice available.
- A strong focus is placed on the personal development of each child.
- There is more flexibility to repeat each subject, if it has not been fully mastered.
- There is less emphasis on examinations and more on continuous assessment.
- Programmes are given quite a lot of flexibility as there is no standardised curriculum monitoring.
- The structure of the programme allows students to easily transfer in and out of US schools.

UK Curriculum

This curriculum encourages children to think independently, to build their own opinions, empathise with others and take responsibility for themselves.

School learning is divided as follows:

The National Curriculum core subjects delivered in Key Stages 1 & 2 ages 5-11 include; Maths, English, Science, Design and Technology, Information and Communication Technology, History, Geography, Art and Design, Music and Physical Education
 During Key Stages 1-3 children must sit for SATs (Standardised Assessment Tests)
 At the end of Key Stage 4 (Year 11), students sit their General Certificate of Secondary Education (GCSE) Exams.

After Key Stage 4 students can either move on to vocational training or continue on to Key Stage 5. Schooling is not mandatory after Key Stage 4 in the UK however most UK Curriculum Secondary schools in Dubai go on until the end of Key Stage 5.


- During Key Stage 5, students are preparing for the A Levels. At the end of the first year, they sit AS Level examinations and at the end of the second year they sit final A Level examinations.

IB Curriculum

The programme begins at 3 years of age and finishes at 19 years.

- An integrated system is offered at Primary level encouraging learning through exploration and structured inquiry
- Emphasis is placed on pupil involvement, actively participating in multi-skilled team based projects
- Assessment is done by tasks initially marked by the teacher, then externally assessed
- The main focus is on building all round skills rather than just academia
- During the last two years of Secondary school, students can choose between obtaining an IB diploma or obtaining individual IB certificates in chosen subjects.
- The full IB Diploma entails taking six subjects, three at the standard level and three at the higher level, as well as an extended research based essay and mandatory hours of unpaid community service.

Chapter 2 Private Schools in Dubai

The operations of Private Schools in Dubai are regulated by the government through the Knowledge and Human Development Authority popularly known as the KHDA. The KHDA ensures that these schools operate at the highest standard possible. 90% of the student population in Dubai attend private schools. More information is available on the [KHDA website](#). Dubai has a variety of private schools on offer with different curricula; the following table illustrates the breakdown of schools according to the curriculum offered.

Private schools in Dubai are inspected annually by the KHDA and based upon a variety of factors such as social and personal development of students, the standard of teaching and assessment. Each school receives one of the following rankings: Outstanding, Very Good, Good, Acceptable or Unsatisfactory. [It is worth bearing in mind that rankings have a strong focus on Arabic Language and Islamic Education. Therefore, it is possible that schools which are ranked as good may in fact be outstanding in most matters except Arabic and Islamic Education.](#) Several (but not all) UK curriculum schools also opt to undergo an additional BSO or British Schools Overseas inspection besides KHDA. This may be helpful if your child would re-enter or enrol in British education system in the future. The BSO framework is also rigorous but does not account for Arabic and Islamic education.

General Admission Process for Private Schools in Dubai

Whether you are applying to a school from overseas or within Dubai, the first step is to contact the School's Admissions Office directly. Admissions timelines and requirements can vary greatly from one school to another and depending on the student's individual situation however, it is generally advisable to apply by December -January for the following September. For some reputable over-subscribed schools, it is recommended to apply even earlier.

Generally, private schools in Dubai have an assessment entrance exam which can consist of various elements such as a written test (language and maths) and an interview depending on the age of the student. Some schools have entrance exams for Grade 1 and above whilst others already start with entrance exams at nursery or kindergarten level.

According to the KHDA, it is necessary to provide proof of your child's previous schooling. All certificates must be presented in English or Arabic; if the originals are in another language, they need to be translated and the translations authenticated by a legal translator.

Besides the sponsor parent's passport, visa and Emirates ID copies, the following documents are usually required for children entering school in Dubai:

- Original Transfer Certificate (attested if necessary, see below) (Year 1 or Kindergarten 1 upwards only)
- Birth certificate (in English or Arabic), 2 copies
- Passport, 2 scan copies
- Residence visa, 2 scan copies
- Emirates ID card (both sides), 1 copy
- Recent passport size photographs, 2
- Immunisation Record

The original Transfer Certificate must contain the following information:

- Date of enrolment at your child's previous school
- Year group placement at previous school
- Date the child left the previous school
- School stamp and signature

Transfer Certificates must be attested by all the following authorities in the country where they were issued, usually in this order:

1. UAE Embassy in country of previous school
2. Ministry of Education in country of previous school
3. Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Dubai

Transfer Certificates issued in the following areas are **generally** exempt from the attestation requirements above:

- Australia
- Canada
- Western Europe
- New Zealand
- USA
- UAE

Please note that some schools may require the Transfer Certificate to be attested even if it was issued by a school in one of the exception countries listed above. It is recommended to check with the school that you are interested in regarding their requirements well before departing for Dubai so that you have enough time to collect the necessary documents.

Placement and Waiting Lists

Following assessment, the school might offer a place to your child. In cases of more popular over-subscribed schools, your child may be placed on a waiting list. Sometimes, there is movement across schools during the re-registration process and it may be possible for your child to eventually be placed. However, to avoid this situation, it is always recommended to apply to more schools as a backup so that you have options for your child's education.

Chapter 3 Shell Education Services Department

Shell's education policy is based on parental responsibility. This includes planning your children's education; considering the long-term consequences; choice of schooling; school registration and de-registration; signing of school contract; enrolment procedures and the payment of school fees (exceptions apply to group invoices). Please note that employees are expected to carry out their own research based on personal choices relating to education.

Shell Education Services Department:

- Advise Shell International staff regarding education of their children between 3 and 19 years old.
- Participate in the management and governance of Shell schools, including teachers' recruitment.
- Governance of education policies within the International Mobility Policy framework.
- Support HR in the Business regarding education issues/advise on quality of education/assist and advise on obtaining school places for children of our Shell expatriates.
- Advise HR Service Centres on all education-related questions.

Chapter 4 Practical tips

There are several questions that you will probably have when visiting/contacting schools that you are considering. It is worth compiling a list of questions to make sure you get the information you need to make the right decision for your family. Here are some suggestions, some of which have been adapted from the Shell Education Services webpage.

Academic Focus

- Is the school solely academic or does it cater for children who have more artistic or vocational skills?
- What are the school's examinations results like?
- How does the school compare with other similar schools?
- Is there a choice of different curriculum systems depending on the students' skills and interests?
- What is the homework load like?
- How are students grouped in a classroom- by ability, mixed or a combination of both?

Admission Process

- How does the school select its students? If by ability, how is this measured? Are there any other criteria?
- What is the demographic and academic profile of current students?
- How many students are being taught in a language that is not their first language?

Additional Support

- What expertise, resources and willingness does the school have to identify and/or support children with learning difficulties?
- How does the school stretch and stimulate students who have advanced skills in a particular subject?

Extracurricular Activities

- Are after school clubs provided by school staff who volunteer or by privately contracted external agencies?
- How often are school trips planned?

Care

- Who is responsible for the students' emotional and social need at school?
- What happens if a child gets ill or injured?

Parental Involvement

- How can parents participate in their children's learning?
- How can parents communicate with teachers?

Staff

- What are the average and maximum class sizes?
- How many teaching staff is available in each class?

Costs

- Are there any scholarships available?
- Are there any additional costs besides tuition fees?

Future Support

- Does the school offer career advice?
- How does the school support students in selecting higher and further education institutions?

Please note that some of these questions are also answered in each school's detailed KHDA report. Please see the KHDA directory to explore latest reports on the schools you are considering.

Things to keep in mind

- Outpost UAE Iraq recommends that you select your child's school before choosing a house because of traffic congestion during rush hours.
- Private schools in Dubai usually have long waiting lists which could bring about delays in securing admission. Consequently, it is advisable to apply to more than one school of your curriculum choice.
- By law, there is a non-refundable application fee of AED 525 (USD 143) including VAT per child per school.
- Furthermore, there is a need to regularly check the admission status with the admission's officer as a follow up. This shows your interest in the school and allows you to get feedback.
- Some restrictions apply in the UAE regarding the possibility of transferring your child to another school (in the UAE) before the end of an academic session. It is important to be aware of such regulations. To transfer during an academic session, you will require approval from the Ministry of Education to be able to change your child's school which may also be granted based on unique circumstances.

In making the final school choice for your children, it may be helpful to contact other Shell families with children in such schools. Outpost UAE Iraq may be able to help you through their Buddy System in connecting with other families who will give you more information about their experience at some schools. In addition, we have also included in this guide, an overview of private schools and their locations which will hopefully help in making the final school choice.

Chapter 5 Overview of a Selection of Private Schools in Dubai

The next few pages display an overview of a selection of private schools in Dubai, categorized by curriculum taught. These are by no means the only schools in Dubai teaching the curriculums in question but are the highest KHDA rated ones in each case, according to 2022 – 2023 ratings. This overview rarely includes schools rated less than 'Good' by KHDA (schools with a rating of 'Acceptable' or 'Weak') except when the school is the only option in the curriculum category or has been previously rated at least 'Good'.

In this latest version of the guide, we have expanded our lists to accommodate newer schools. We often find that newer schools often have ready availability of seats and will not necessarily put you on a waiting list.

UK Curriculum Schools in Dubai








